I was given everything including school fees, books, uniform, medication and provided with food right from baby class up to when I finished Senior six (Advanced level)”*.

Jane graduated with a Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education from Comprehensive College – Kitetikka (Uganda). She has been admitted at Kampala University for a nursing course and she hopes to join the university this year.



Through the sponsorship program, the mother was able to save money for the young siblings and they are able to attend school and from the little savings made; her mother has been able to construct a semi – permanent house for accommodation to the children.
